

Kear Campus School Youth, Family & Community Learning Service South Lanarkshire



Kear Campus is an SEBN school provision, educating young people from Primary 1 – S6 across 7 sites in South Lanarkshire. Young people who attend Kear Campus can have experienced previous barriers to accessing learning and achievement within mainstream settings. Teachers, youth workers and other agencies connected to Kear work together to build bespoke timetables for young people that meet their individual needs. The Youth, Family and Community Learning (YFCL) service works across all of the Kear sites to offer tailored access to youth work for young people as an integrated part of the school timetable—ranging from one-to-one weekly—or sometimes daily—nurture sessions to group work focused on raising confidence, developing skills and raising aspirations. YFCL also provides support throughout school holiday times to young people and families.

Programmes and groups are designed in partnership with the school and in consultation with families. YFCL staff access funds for programmes through the school's main budget in addition to sourcing external funding for groups. YFCL have two dedicated classrooms and one nurture room within the main Kear school building, as well as a dedicated outreach space.

Direct Impact	142 young people accessed youth work support through the YFCL team in 2019-20. These young people showed improvements in health and wellbeing, engagement in learning and the developed a range of skills.
Accredited awards	30 young people attained awards including Hi5!, Bronze and Silver Youth Achievement Awards, John Muir Award, Sports Leadership Award, Sports Leadership Certificate
